

X-Rays



X-rays take pictures of the body and bones.



X-rays are carried out at your local hospital.



You need to tell the receptionist your name and hand in your referral form.



You may need to sit in the waiting room until staff call out your name.



For some x-rays you may need to change into a hospital gown.



You will go from the changing room to the x-ray room.



You may have to stand for the x-ray.



You may have to lie down for the x-ray.



The radiographer will tell you what they are doing.



The radiographer will line up the x-ray machine to the part of your body they need a picture of.



The radiographer will stand behind a screen to take the x-ray.



The radiographer will tell you what to do next after having your x-ray.
